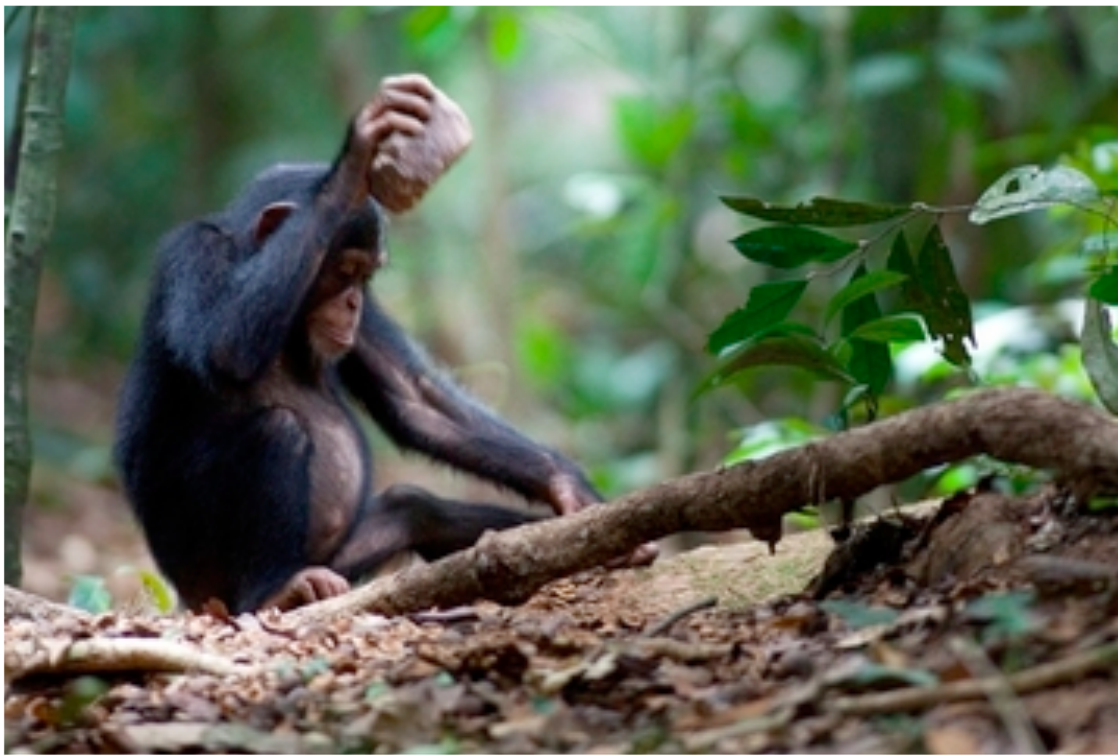


The Evolution of Altruism
